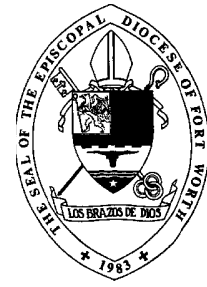

## From the Rector:



**BELOVED** in Christ,

**T**HE December issue of the Epistle always confronts me with a dilemma. Here it is the beginning of Advent, so should I write about that, or should I write

about Christmas?

**W**ELL, why should I be immune from the problem that confronts us all annually? The marketing people want us all to begin the "holidays" now. Thanksgiving marks the beginning of the secular holiday season and New Year's Day ends it. I solemnly declare that I am now beginning my annual rebellion.

**W**ELL, sort of. You see, I really do like this time of year. Who wouldn't? What a great problem to have - finding the right gift to give someone else! Or figuring out how to schedule things so that you can celebrate with everyone you want to celebrate with. Celebrating, giving, these are good things, right? - So what's the problem.

**T**HERE is not a problem ... really. My concern as your pastor is that we keep things in their proper perspective. I am glad that our part of the world has a "holiday season." I want the Christian part of our world to remember why that is, so we can share the Good News. And I want us to be about our celebrating and our giving in a way that communicates our gratitude to God for what he has given us - nothing less than His only-begotten Son.

**H**OW to do that? Keep Advent. Don't be in a huge hurry to put up all the Christmas decorations all at once. Do it in stages. Start with an Advent Wreath. Put it where you eat. Use it - daily if you can. We've got a booklet here at the Church that will guide you through the season. Over the course of the next three

weeks, if you just have to, put up the decorations, but do it a little bit at a time. If your neighbors ask you what you are doing, they are presenting you with the perfect opportunity to invite them to come to Church at Christmas. I know, the Advent purists among us are going to jump all over me for caving in. I am not. Advent is a season of preparation - so be intentional about it.

**M**AKE sure that in addition to the outward preparing that you are making some inward preparation as well. Are you living your life as you ought to? How prepared is your spiritual house? Is it fit for a king? The King? I am always available to hear confessions by appointment. I will be in the Church on Saturday the 12th from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. for confessions. If you would just like to talk about the state of your soul, I'm always glad to do that too. Give me a call at 817 560-7187.

**T**HE Basic Christianity Class will be taking a break from classes for the holidays beginning on Wednesday the 16th through January 6th.

**W**E WILL do our decorating at the Church on the afternoon of the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the 20th. We'll meet at 4:00 p.m. for our annual **Potluck Chili Supper and Decorating Party**. Come prepared to lend a hand with the decorating and stay for the Chili. We ask everyone

to bring either a pot of Chili or some of whatever is good with it. Will you make plans to be with us? Guests are definitely welcome. If you can't handle heavy lifting, don't worry - tree ornaments don't weigh that much. This is a chance for us all to get together. So make some room in your schedule. The more the merrier.

**C**HRISTMAS Eve falls on Thursday this year. We will have two services that night. The first, at 7:00 p.m., will be a Sung Mass without Incense. And then at 10:30 p.m., we will have Lessons & Carols followed by a Solemn Mass (Incense & the works)

**T**HE three days following Christmas Day are major feast days in their own right, Saint Stephen's Day, Saint John's Day, and the feast of the Holy Innocents'. With Sunday intervening, we will keep these days as they come, starting on Saturday. Saturday we will remember Saint Stephen at 9:00 AM; On Monday, Saint John will be commemorated at a 6:30 pm Mass, and then at our usual 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday we will recall the Holy Ones of Bethlehem.
